RESOLUTION OF ABANDONMENT

VICTOR M. MENDEZ, Director, Arizona Department of Transportation, on October 18, 2002, presented and filed with this Transportation Board his written report under Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7046, recommending the abandonment of portions of Interstate Business Route 19, formerly U.S. Route 89, and State Route 86 within the above referenced project.

The portions of right of way to be abandoned are depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Intermodal Transportation Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled "Right of Way Plans, TUCSON URBANIZED AREA Highway, Project N-801-601 / 999SW000H088801R."

WHEREAS said portions of right of way are no longer needed for State highway purposes and the City of Tucson has agreed to accept jurisdiction in accordance with Intergovernmental Agreements 95-121 dated March 19, 1996 and 97-07 dated May 20, 1998; and

WHEREAS this Board finds that public safety, necessity and convenience will be served by accepting the Director's report; therefore, be it

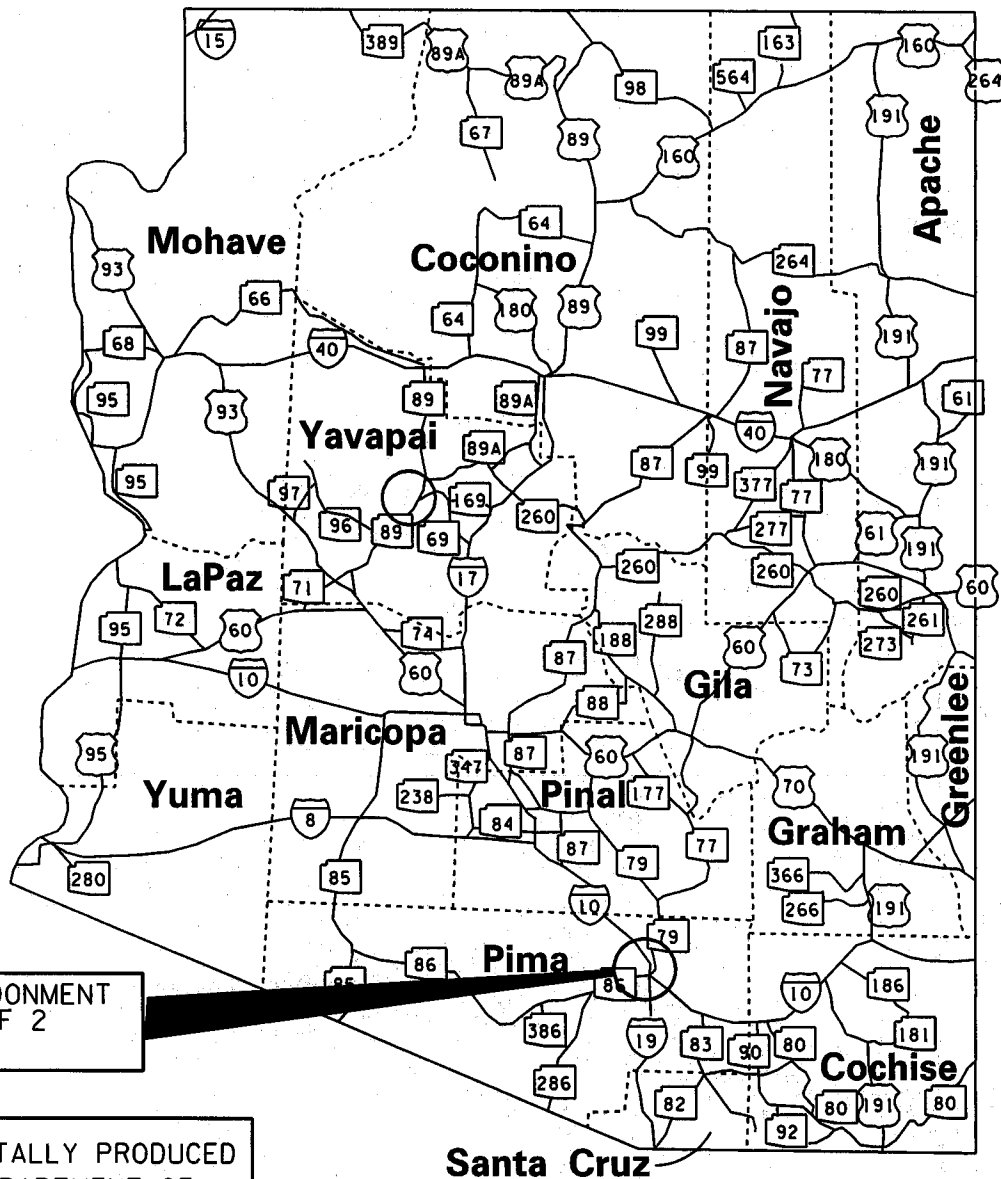
RESOLVED that the recommendation of the Director is adopted and made part of this resolution; be it further

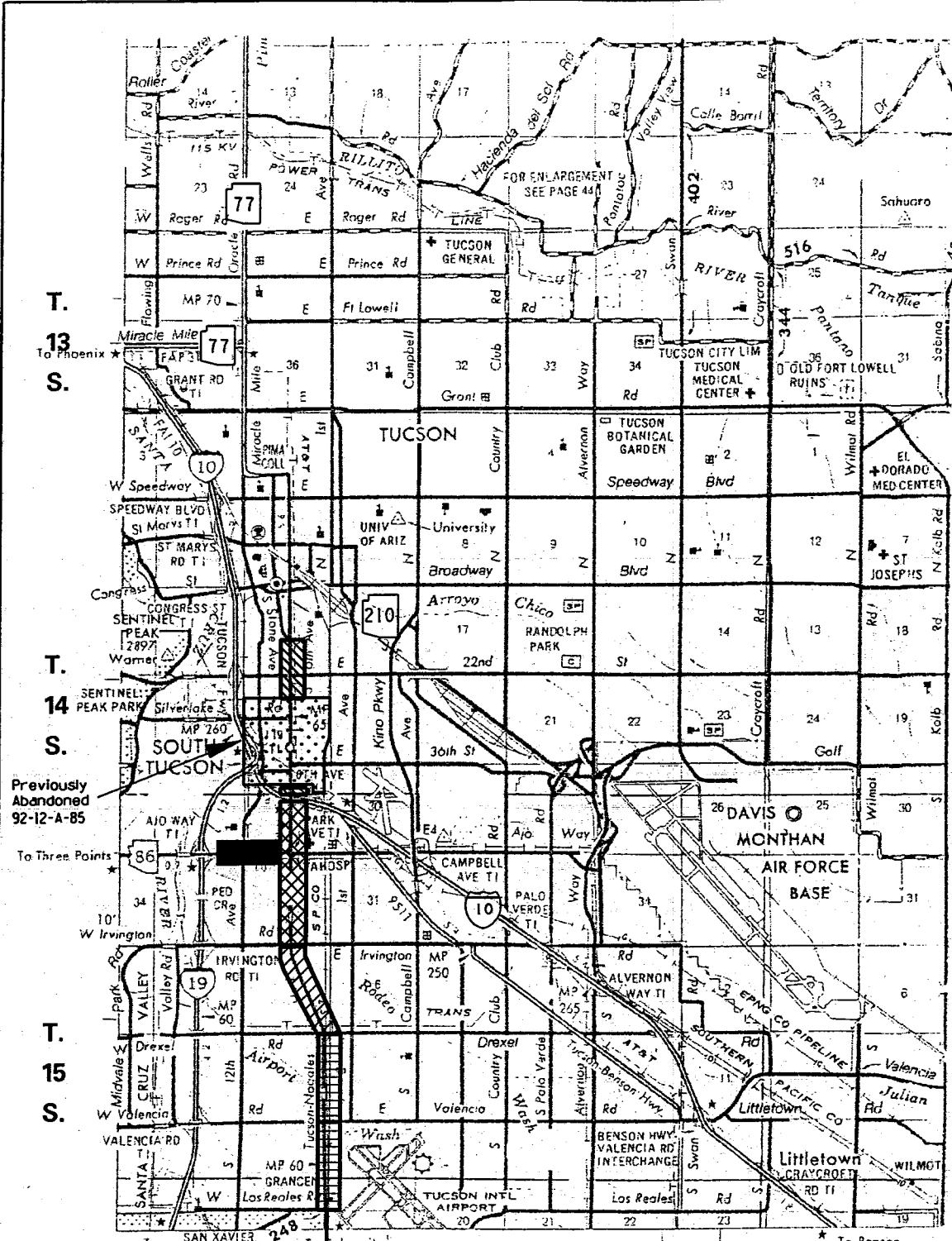

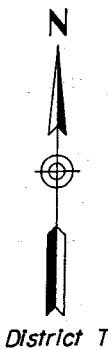

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the abandonment of portions of right of way acquired for Interstate Business Route 19, formerly U.S. Route 89, and State Route 86 within the above referenced project.

These portions were previously established as State Routes and State Highways by various Resolutions.

Portions of the previously acquired right of way are no longer needed for state transportation purposes. The City of Tucson has agreed to accept jurisdiction of the right of way in accordance with Intergovernmental Agreements 95-121 dated March 19, 1996 and 97-07 dated May 20, 1998. Accordingly, I recommend that the State's interest in the portions of right of way be abandoned.

The portions of right of way to be abandoned are depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on the maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Intermodal Transportation Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled "Right of Way Plans, TUCSON URBANIZED AREA Highway, Project N-801-601 / 999SW000H088801R."

I further recommend that the portions of right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be removed from the State Highway System and abandoned to the City of Tucson.


